OAK SAVANNA PROJECT UPDATE

A project is currently underway to restore a 17-acre section of rare Oak Savanna habitat at Indian Lake County Park.

Restoration has begun and Valton Log and Lumber was able to clear and prepare about five acres for restoration by removing black locust trees and other trees that are not part of the oak savanna ecosystem. They will return in the spring to continue working on the site.

In the next few weeks, staff and volunteers will start treating brush and weeds in the cleared areas and will pile cut brush into burn piles. Native plant seeds will be scattered this fall and winter to help stabilize the soil and prevent erosion as the restoration project moves forward.

BUTTERFLY AND INSECT BIOBLITZ

Here's what to do BEFORE August 10th:

- 1. Hike the prairie or farmyard at Schumacher Farm County Park and take photos of any butterflies, insects and moths you see.
- 2. Email your best photos to infoeschumacherfarmpark.org with "Bioblitz Pics" in the subject line.

The will compile all the photos into one album and schedule a special Zoom identification session with a local entomologist in August to identify the species and talk a little bit about them.
