1. Call Meeting to Order

Meeting was called to order at 1:39 am on August 3rd, 2020

2. Approve Agenda

Motion to approve by Jim Landwehr, second by Doug Avoles. Motion carried.

3. Statewide Parcel Map Survey

a. Results of Survey

Results of the statewide parcel survey sent out to the LIO Network were broken down by Zachery and then discussed. In a brief synopsis to each question:

Total respondents were 38, or 53% of the counties in the state.

- 1. Responses to question 1 were heavily in favor (76%) of the State providing advance notice as early as October of every annual cycle for any changes to the schema.
- 2. Responses to question 2 were split roughly 50/25/25 with 20 respondents mentioning that a year-end cutoff of parcels would be preferable, 9 mentioned that they were okay with the current and 9 had no opinion. (A more detailed summary of all results forthcoming.)
- 3. Responses to question 3 were also roughly 50/50. Most concerns were with the amount of schema changes, the preferred provision of geometry only with DOR providing all attribute data which is housed there already.
- 4. Responses to question 4 were approximately 75% positive for participants currently using ArcGIS services

5. Question 5 was deemed unquantifiable. Concerns came through about data timing conflicts and the responsibility of DOR vs Land Information Offices for providing State data to the State. More coordination with the State DOA regarding potential schema changes being discussed with WLIA or LION prior to initiating them, enabling DOA to hear concerns and for WLIA/LION to ask questions.

b. Recommendations

Zachery Newton will prepare a quantified report of the survey results and bundle it with the raw results and present it to DOA. He will also work on preparing a letter to Peter Herreid to express the sentiments and results of the survey.

4. Any other business

Fred lausly mentioned that two WLIA Committees, (Technical and Policy) were drafting a letter to DMA requesting that funding sources need to be addressed and made available for counties to pursue NG911 data preparation.

Also mentioned that 6 additional counties were added to the GeoComm Gap Analysis pilot project. The additional counties should provide a better cross section of data to address potential database schema issues.
